
School Attendance

We're here to support you in getting your child ready and motivated for school every day. When your child is absent it is important you let us know, including the reason why on the day or the day before. This helps make sure we know where our students are and offer support for you and your family if needed.

Please contact us if your child needs to miss school for any reason, so we can plan continued support for your child's learning and wellbeing.

Did you know that if your child misses as little as 1 day per week, they will miss 40 days of school and 8 weeks of learning in 1 year. Over an entire school journey, this adds up to 2.5 years of lost learning.

We have had a very exciting 2 weeks with lots of celebrating to be done for student's achievements. We have been busy testing and there is lots to celebrate. Students are jumping reading levels and have a fantastic understanding of what they are reading. We have completed some great writing and students are showing so much improvement in the way they are writing. They are beginning to make their writing more interesting for the reader by using some great vocabulary and extending their use of punctuation to enhance what they are trying to say. We have several students working above their level which is great to see. Their enthusiasm for learning is magnificent to see and I am extremely proud of each and every student. We will continue to revise and build on our great work as the term progresses.

Wednesday, we had a fabulous excursion to Torrumbarry Weir and Rochester and Colbinabbin Silos.

Life-skills and Respectful Relationships

There has been a lot of great learning happening across all subject areas from our students. In Science this week we have explored the topic of chemical reactions. Our first activity involved blowing up balloons with the chemical reaction resulting from mixing Bi-carb soda and vinegar. We also looked at the chemical reactions of Alka-seltzer in water, and used this reaction in fun ways such as for launching a pop rocket.

Music continues to be a highlight to finish our day on Thursday afternoons. We have explored beat and rhythm with clapping and other body movement, and also introduced rhythm sticks to our repertoire. Students are finding their vocal confidence, with familiar songs to sing along to. We have also been enjoying learning some 'new' songs that were perhaps childhood favourites of previous generations!

In Respectful Relationships our final topic of learning focuses around Positive Gender Relations. Within this topic we will explore what respectful, gender inclusive behaviours look like in action, informed by human rights. We will look at conflict situations to consider possible responses such as, safely end, intervene or withdraw. To conclude we will be able to describe help-seeking skills and strategies that can be used when encountering uncomfortable or unsafe situations.
